Resolution Acknowledging SCCLC’s Obligations for Special Education

Whereas

- San Carlos Charter Learning Center (SCCLC) is a California public charter in operation since 1994 serving pupils from grades Kindergarten through eight grade; and
- California Education Code section 47641(a) allows a charter school that meet certain requirements to be deemed a local educational agency (LEA) for the purposes of compliance with federal law and for eligibility for federal and state special education funds; and
- SCCLC’s governing board approved a proposal to apply for admission to the San Mateo County SELPA on December 14, 2011;

it is therefore resolved by the governing board of SCCLC that

SCCLC acknowledges that, upon being admitted as an LEA member of the SELPA, it has an obligation to “search and serve”, and that SCCLC is obligated to pay the costs of special education whether or not those costs are adequately covered from SCCLC’s SELPA allocation. SCCLC further affirms that it has adequate fiscal reserves to cover these costs, which may include, but are not limited to, instruction, transportation, non-public school/agency placements, inter and intra SELPA placements, due process proceedings, complaints, and attorney fees..
